

II. ANALYZES HUMAN RESPONSES USING CRITICAL THINKING TO DERIVE THERAPEUTIC GOALS FOR ILL INDIVIDUALS AND THEIR FAMILIES

7. Monitors the patient for the occurrence of therapeutic and side effects for all therapies.
8. Relates human responses to interpersonal contexts (1:1, group, environment).
