This on-line course is designed to:

- Enhance the recognition of injury or illness arising as a result of public health emergencies, including exposure to select biological, chemical and radiological agents.
- Provide training in the timely reporting and activation of health care systems in response to public health emergencies.
- Emphasize the importance of a coordinated interdisciplinary response to public health emergencies, including natural disasters, pandemic influenza, suspected bioterrorism events.

Prerequisite: Enrollment in a UW Health Sciences School of Nursing, Public Health, Pharmacy, Medicine, MEDEX, Social Work or Dentistry. Others by permission.
