

Teaching Assistant Position (25% FTE) Winter Quarter 2010

Provide support for **NURS 410 Legal and Ethical Issues in Clinical Practice**: Identification of ethical and legal issues and the ensuing dilemmas relevant to the profession of nursing and nurses as health professionals and citizens. Selected problems and dilemmas affecting nurses, nursing, and the delivery of health care analyzed using specific moral-ethical perspectives. Class held on Wednesdays. Students are baccalaureate nursing students in second year of curriculum.

Roles and Responsibilities of the TA include:

Teaching Assistant will work with the instructor to provide assistance and support with class and course materials:

- Attending class: NURS 410 meets from 9:30-12:20pm on Wednesdays throughout Winter quarter
- Posting and updating course material on the course web page
- Assistance in grading papers
- Duplication and distribution of educational material
- Assistance in course preparation
- Assistance in tracking student assignments, attendance and other matters related to administrative tasks
- Assistance in obtaining audiovisual equipment and materials as necessary for the classes
- Providing assistance for students as necessary
- Other duties as assigned when needed

Qualifications:

The Teaching Assistant must have:

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Excellent literature search skills and writing skills
- Ability to work independently
- Ability to solve problems creatively
- Knowledge and experience in teaching technology and computer skills
- Knowledge of bioethics strongly preferred
- Some teaching experience preferred

Duration: Winter Quarter 2010: Winter pay period runs December 16, 2009 – March 15, 2010. Exact dates and hours of employment will be arranged between the TA and course faculty, Dr. Sarah Shannon.

Salary Range: Graduate student salaries and promotions are based on the UW's standard salary schedule. Appointment is governed by a union contract, and **TA must maintain enrollment of 10 credits**. Note- Non-U.S. citizens hired to perform teaching duties must (1) meet English language proficiency requirements and (2) participate fully in the International Teaching Assistant Program at the Center for Instructional Development and Research (CIDR). Documentation will be requested prior to appointment.
